### KS2 Data

Progress and attainment outcomes for Grove Road have improved in almost every area this year. Whilst 61% of pupils nationally reached the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths combined, 67% of children at Grove Road have reached this challenging national benchmark (compared to only 53% of our pupils last year). Our provisional test data shows that results have risen in all areas when compared to last year, as well as exceeding national averages.

Children have worked exceptionally hard to get to grips with the new curriculum expectations and we are delighted with the progress they have made, particularly in Reading, where the children have needed to improve their vocabulary, reading stamina and high level inference skills. An additional challenge was a grade boundary shift in Reading. This year, pupils needed to score 26 out of a possible 50 marks to achieve the expected standard, compared to 21 last year.

**Thresholds that will determine the percentage of children exceeding age related expectations are still to be confirmed, but if they remain the same as last year, we anticipate that 20% will exceed the standard in Maths, 33% in Reading, 18.3% in Writing and 43% in Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar.**

Progress scores are displayed above. In Year 6 95% of children made expected progress in Maths, 96% in Reading and 98% in Writing. This puts outcomes at Grove Road above the national average for both progress and attainment and fully reflects the hard work and determination of the children and their outstanding attitudes to learning. Feedback from Tring Secondary School is that pupils from Grove Road go on to display a highly reflective and evaluative approach to their learning, making them resilient learners.
