





Word Problems

To support our skills in reasoning and mental arithmetic in Maths, we would like you to write your very own word problems.

For example:

- A pirate has 12 gold coins. He gives half of them away. How many coins does he have left?
- Captain Blackbeard has three treasure chests. Each treasure chest has 10 gold coins. How many coins does he have altogether?
- 12 pirates sail away on four boats. There are an equal number of pirates on each boat. How many pirates are on each boat?

They could involve addition, subtraction, multiplication or division. The choice is yours.
